

VILLAGERS in Thorncombe are up in arms over a planning application to convert an historic building into holiday homes and build 25 houses on land owned by a local councillor.

Dozens of objections to the proposals had been received this week by West Dorset District Council.

The planning application will go before the council's planning committee today (Thursday). Discussion will be be deferred until planning officials have looked into it further.

Villagers believe that the development, if approved, will ruin the quiet West Dorset village, which is in an official area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

The application has been submitted by Bridport sur-veyor Michael Fearn, who is acting as agent for Thorncombe farmer and councillor Jim Atyeo who owns the property named on the plans. Mr Fearn was not available for comment when contacted. on the matter to West Dorset District Council's planning department.
