GARDEN BIRDS.

PUBLIC MEETING.

The Trust have heard from Mr.D.D.Derrien, the Chief Planning Officer, that his report regarding development in Thorncombe is proceeding but that it is unlikely to be completed until towards the end of October, at which time he will be prepared to visit Thorncombe and hold a Public Meeting to give his findings and permit discussion. Date of this meeting will be notified later.

M.P. VISITS VILLAGE.

Jim Spicer, the Member of Parliament for West Dorset, visited Thorncombe on 29 August 1986 to meet the committee of the Trust and Lt.Col.C.H.Gibson, County Councillor, to discuss the proposed large scale housing developments in the village. He was taken on a tour of the proposed sites and to see the narrow access lanes that surround the village. After a question and answer session the M.P. said that he was now in a much better position, with first-hand knowledge of our problems, to help us when he next met individuals from the County and District Councils and other authorities. Everyone involved considered that the  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours were very well spent.

RURAL DEVELOPMENT SEMINAR.

The Thorncombe Village Trust organised a Seminar on Saturday 13 September 1986 in the Village Hall. The object was to bring together other villages in the area facing similar over development, to see if we could all learn from each others experience and perhaps put a united proposal to the Planning Authorities. Six other villages took part with speakers from each giving a brief history of their own individual development problems. Mr.Trevor Jones OBE. spoke on the dilema facing the Planning Officers under the double pressure from both the developers and the Structure Plan Policy. He added that it was vital to influence the District Councils with individual written statements about over development and its consequence upon the community. Mr.Trevor Harris, an architect with much local experience with the Structure Plan, spoke about the importance and need for a Local Plan to be done by the Parish, with due regard to time, scale and geology. The inherant character of the village which may not be apparent to the developers must be brought to the attention of the District Council Planning Committee. After an excellent lunch deligates formed into smaller discussion groups. The general feeling was that all the villages present were under great threat and should step up the fight for the future of our communities. It is hoped to hold a follow up meeting of this extremely informative day sometime in November. Those villages attending the Seminar were: Beaminster, Hawkchurch, Mosterton, Pucknowle, Sth. Perrott, and Oake.

The Coffee morning held at June Ede's, Church View on 9 August was a great success and enjoyed by the many people who attended. The sum of \$60.00 was raised for Trust funds. Many thanks to all who helped and especially to June and her family for the use of their home.
